Florence Nightingale stressed that it was not meant to be a comprehensive guide from which to teach oneself to be a nurse but to help in the practice of treating others. Joan Quixley, the head of the Nightingale School of Nursing, wrote in 1974 that despite the passage of time since Notes on Nursing was published, the book astonishes one with its relevance to modern attitudes and skills in nursing, whether this be practised at home by the ordinary woman, in hospital or in the community. The social, economic and professional differences of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries in no way hinder the young student or pupil from developing, if he or she is motivated to do so, its unchanged fundamentals by way of intelligent thought and practice. With its mid-nineteenth century background of poverty, neglect, ignorance and prejudice the book was a challenge to contemporary...



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
